Karli began her equestrian career at Foxfield in Westlake Village, riding with her grandmother JoAnn Postel and great-aunt Nancy Turrill. A member of the Foxfield Equestrian Team, she learned both horsemanship skills and hunter-jumper basics.

In her high school years, she transitioned to show-focused training with Kathy Megla and Holly Scapa, concentrating in equitation and jumpers. After transitioning to the show ring, she almost immediately was 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Rosewood Medal and won the Ronnie Mutch Scholarship. Winning the Ronnie Mutch she gained the opportunity to train with Missy Clark and John Brennan. Karlie continued riding and began training others while earning a degree in Psychology at Goucher College. After graduating in 2013, she became part of Cross Creek Farm's staff in Malibu, gaining more experience training horses and riders full time.

Karli resides at the prestigious Brookway Stables as Assistant Trainer to Archie Cox, one of the most successful trainers in the Country. She brings her passion and knowledge to the team at Brookway and has spent the last two years teaching, training and riding Brookway's impressive roster of horses to national fame. You will often see her showing alongside another well known Brookway rider John French.

In 2017, Karli won the Southwest Region Champion for Developing Professionals. She continued on to be the National Reserve Champion for Developing Professionals in 2017. In addition, she also rode Meant to Be, owned by Karin Binz to USEF Horse of the Year Champion Young Hunter and Grand Young Hunter Champion.

In 2018, Karli again won the Southwest Region for Developing Professionals. Then she continued on to win the WCHR (World Champion Hunter Rider) National Champion for Developing Professionals as well as the WCHR \$5,000 championship class. During 2018, Karli also won the \$25,000 WCHR West Coast Hunter Spectacular. She has placed in numerous International Hunter derbies. USEF Horse of the Year 2018.

In 2019 World Champion Undersaddle on Favorite for Teton Farms. 2019 Reserve Champion at the Washington International Horseshow for High Performance Hunters on Get Rowdy also owned by Teton Farms. USEF Horse of the Year rider 2019.

2020 Received her large "R" card.
